# Study Abroad for Women's Studies

# Why study Women's Studies abroad?

- To understand the field of women's studies and the theory and practice of it from an international perspective.
  - To expand your cross-cultural communication and problem solving skills through service-learning, community-based learning, or an internship.
  - To gain insight into the lives of women and girls in different parts of the world.
  - To enhance your critical thinking skills and gain confidence in yourself personally and professionally.
  - To fulfill requirements for the major/minor.
  - To fulfill Core or language requirements.

## Yeah, but...

# • Can I take my Women's Studies courses in English?

Yes. Women's Studies courses in English are offered worldwide. It is often possible to study WMST in English in a non-English-speaking country and take introductory language at the same time. Or, if you have the appropriate prerequisites, you may take WMST courses in another language.

### • Can I afford it?

YES! The cost of studying abroad is within the reach of most UST students. Financial aid applies to semester study abroad, and students not currently receiving financial aid may be eligible for loans. In addition, there are special scholarships for studying abroad.

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### So...what do I do next?

- Begin planning right away. It is never too early to start planning. Stop by the IEC, sign up for a "First Step" session (go to their website for details, see left), and use their library to begin researching destinations.
- Set some goals. There is not one program best suited for all Women's Studies students. You need to determine which one best fits you. Prioritize your goals. Consider your long-term academic, professional, and career goals.
- Think about what you want to learn from (and what you can contribute to) the program, college, and country where you want to be.
- Prepare academically. You may need to take prerequisites or plan for classes upon your return.
- Start a budget.

#### Academic Planning:

- In consultation with your academic advisor, create a tentative "4-year" academic schedule ASAP (see sample below). By doing this, you will determine when, during your academic career, studying abroad best fits you. Although most Women's Studies students go abroad during the spring of their junior year or fall of their senior year, you should go abroad when it fits into your schedule, including J-Term or summer.
- It is best to take Women's Studies core courses at St. Thomas-- that is, WMST 205 and 327 before going abroad.
- As part of your application process, you must identify particular courses of interest and get them approved *before* you depart. Finally, in addition to studying abroad, you should also consider research, service-learning, internships, volunteer and extracurricular experiences off-campus, just as you do when you are on campus.
